

Passenger declaration for traveling with a “Portable Air Concentrator”

This document must be presented to airline representatives when checking in at the airport.

This document must be signed by the passenger traveling with the portable oxygen concentrator.

- I am responsible for ensuring that the model of oxygen concentrator in accordance with the models allowed on board.

In accordance with FAA regulations, only the following models are allowed on board:

Airsep “Lifestyle,” produced by the Airsep corporation
Inogen One, produced by the Inogen corporation
Airsep “Freestyle,” produced by the Airsep corporation
SeQual Eclipse produced by SeQual Technologies Inc.
Respironics Evergo, produced by Respironics Inc.

- I am responsible for ensuring that the oxygen concentrator and its batteries are in good condition, undamaged and packed correctly in order to prevent damage and short circuits.
- I am responsible for carrying the necessary amount of batteries in accordance with the duration of the flights and my oxygen needs. In addition, I am carrying an additional supplement (of at least three hours) to ensure the oxygen concentrator’s adequate performance in case my flight lasts longer than expected.
- I understand that the airline is not responsible for providing POC batteries or an energy source during the flight. Nor is it responsible for providing any POC-related equipment or accounting for the POC’s state of maintenance.
- I am capable of hearing the oxygen concentrator’s alarms, of seeing the alarm indicator, and of taking action in response to these alarms. Failing this, I am traveling with a companion who can.
